

“The Face in the Courthouse Window” – Carrollton, Alabama-- Friday, April 20.

Join us as we explore and enjoy one of the most famous “ghost” stories in Alabama. The story began in 1878. Henry Wells was accused of burning down the old courthouse. Following his arrest, an angry mob marched to the new courthouse. Wells, imprisoned in the garret, approached the window to see the crowd just as lightning flashed across the sky. The mob did force their way into the courthouse and took his life. Imagine their surprise as the light of a new day revealed his face in the garret window. The image of a face remains to this day. The story has now become a play and is the focus of our trip. In addition to the play, we’ll add a few miles and travel to Aliceville for a late lunch at the Plantation House, which is on the list of “Dishes to Eat in Alabama Before You Die” for their specialty dish, fried rabbit. No...rabbit will not be on our buffet, but there may be samples for those interested. While there, we will tour the POW museum and also enjoy a stop at Jerry Brown Pottery in Hamilton and take a look at his world renowned works of art.
